



## **Prakash C. Sarangi**

Prof. Sarangi is a Professor of Political Science and the Director of Study in India Program (SIP). He holds an MA from Delhi University and a Ph.D. from the University of Rochester (USA). He has been teaching since 1975 and became a Professor in 1998. He was on the faculty of Utkal University, Bhubaneswar and was an Academic Fellow at the American Studies Research Centre, Hyderabad before joining the University of Hyderabad in 1987. He was a Head of the Department of Political Science during 2004-2007.

Prof. Sarangi's academic interests revolve around Democratic Theory and Practice. His current research is on the impact of globalization on democratic politics and institutions. Recently he organized an international seminar on "Challenges of Globalization" in collaboration with Deakin University, Australia. Papers of the seminar will be shortly published in an edited volume.

His recent awards include Fulbright Visiting Lecturer Award at University of Wisconsin-Madison in 2000, Linnaeus Palme Fellow at University of Uppsala, Sweden, in 2002, Fulbright Visiting Specialist Award at University of Illinois, Chicago in 2004, Baden-Wurttemberg Fellow at University of Heidelberg, Germany in 2006 and Visiting Scholar Award at Deakin University, Melbourne, Australia in 2006.
